

Armed Holdup Prevention and Management

This course is focused on skilling staff to respond to an armed robbery to save lives and assist in reducing the liability of the organisation. This is done by ensuring that all participants are made aware of policy, procedures and their responsibility to comply with these statements.

The trainer will conduct a site visit before the training to identify and photograph high risk areas. These photographs are then used in the training for participants to work through assessing the risk in their work area.

Participants are engaged actively from the beginning of the course to understand the benefits of being prepared for an Armed Robbery in the workplace and daily life. They are engaged in the process of understanding their responsibilities under the Occupational Health and Safety Act to be aware of their obligations and preventing the opportunities for armed robberies.

Participants are guided through a process of identifying risks and opportunities within the workplace which provide opportunities for robbery offences to occur.

DURATION: 4 hours

COST: On application

FACILITATOR: Delivered by trainers who specialises armed hold up prevention and management, with extensive qualifications and experience. They have an extensive Local Government client list, as well as clients like LendLease, NSW Police and Community Youth Clubs (PCYC), NSW Attorney General's Crime Prevention Division and NSW Department of Housing.

COURSE OUTLINE

This training course has been designed to provide participants with;

1. Identify the factors that impact on staff, employees and management of a business when confronted with an armed hold-up.
2. Identify the principles that need to be implemented in surviving an armed confrontation.
3. Identify the some possible effects of being involved in an armed robbery and the correct procedures to minimise the impact to personnel.
4. Identify the employee safety and well-being is the primary objective
Identify the compliance requirements with legislation for safety in the workplace

WHO SHOULD ATTEND THE COURSE?

This course will be of benefit to any staff working in a customer service or similar role that requires them to handle cash or otherwise operate in a high risk area.
