

# Certificate II in Local Government (Operational Works) LGA20204

This nationally recognised qualification will help operational staff who are new to Local Government to be able to perform various tasks within the prescribed framework of local government. This will be ideal for people starting out as roads maintenance officers.

It will provide participants with general skills such as OH&S and organising work priorities as well as more specific work-related skills such as in the construction and maintenance of council's infrastructure.

It is anticipated that all participants will be working within an organisation where they will be able to practice the skills being developed.

## **Delivery and Assessment**

The Local Government Training Institute has developed this program to offer flexibility with ongoing support. To gain this certificate, participants can combine recognition of current work-related skills and knowledge with structured training and assessment.

Participants will undertake this qualification in their work place with Local Government Training Institute.

At the start of the program, participants will be given a Learner's Toolkit – containing learners guides, reading materials, work based projects, self-assessment checklists and appropriate assessment tasks.

They will be contacted on a regular basis by the staff at Local Government Training Institute, staff to offer support and to monitor and assess their progress. Phone and email support is available at all times.

## **Duration**

It will normally take 18 months to complete the learning and assessment for this qualification.

## **Incentives**

LGAWORK208A	Perform field support duties in the construction and maintenance of water reticulation systems
LGAWORK209A	Perform field support duties in the construction and maintenance of sewerage collection systems
LGAWORK210A	Perform field support duties in concrete construction
LGAWORK211A	Perform field support duties in the construction and maintenance of drainage systems
LGAWORK212A	Perform field support duties in a roadwork environment

And up to 5 units are from any section of the Local Government Training Package at the Certificate II level and/or any other endorsed Training Package at Certificate II.
