

Licence to Perform Dogging (CPCCLDG3001A)

This course is a legal requirement for any person who directs the operators of mobile and tower cranes. This course will provide the skills and knowledge required to direct the operator, to safely sling and direct loads, and to maintain and care for dogging equipment.

The aim of this course is to train participants in dogging skills in accordance with the OHS Act 2000/Regulation 2001 and WorkCover licensing requirements. It provides participants with a licence issued by WorkCover.

This course requires participants to complete reading tasks, written assessments and load calculation (including working with angles). The calculations and mathematics component can be challenging. Participants need to apply themselves to successfully complete the calculations and assessments. Participants also need to learn knots, hand and whistle signals. This is not a simple course and extra study is required.

Before and during the training, it is vital that you commit extra time to study of course materials. This will ensure you have the best chance possible of completing the assessment exam to Workcover standards and being accredited as a dogman.

DURATION: 5 days (4 days training, 1 day assessment)

WHAT TO BRING:

- A WorkCover Assessment Instrument and course Easy Guide will be posted to you upon registration for this course. You must familiarise yourself with these documents prior to doing the course. You will also need to bring them along on the day of training.
- For assessment each participant **MUST** have personal identification that adds up to 100 points. Please see over the page for identification requirements.

Participants without ID will be sent home and will not be able to be assessed.

- Hard hat* (available for purchase from the Local Government Training Institute)
- High visibility vest or clothing* (available for purchase from the Local Government Training Institute)
- Enclosed shoes (thongs are not acceptable)
- Good quality whistle (referee type whistle - available for purchase from the Local Government Training Institute)

After the course \$65 must also be paid directly to WorkCover to get wallet card. This is done at the Post Office. Please also take a passport sized photograph to the Post Office with you.

COURSE OUTLINE:

This workshop is a combination of theory and practical in the following areas:

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| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Inspection of equipment • Fibre ropes • Plan work and prepare work • Slinging techniques | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Load movement • Signals • Load placement |
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At the completion of this workshop, participants will undertake assessments and need to meet the requirements of the unit “**CPCCLDG3001A Licence to perform dogging**” from the nationally accredited *Construction, Plumbing and Services Training Package* (CPC08).



The national standards for this high risk unit of competency state participants must be able to:

- apply to move loads in conjunction with cranes including, the reading of tags, slinging, loading, directing and landing loads with a slewing mobile crane with a telescopic boom and a winch, in and out of sight of the crane/ operator, moving four loads of varying shapes, sizes and weights.
- use fibre and/or synthetic rope as tag lines, and connecting to loads using clove hitch, rolling hitch, bowline and single sheetbend.
- conduct pre and post operational checks of the lifting equipment.
- comply with Commonwealth, state or territory OHS legislation, standards relevant to safe dogging and crane operations.
- communicate and work safely with others in the work area.
- apply Hazard prevention and control measures consistent with appropriate standards.

Upon successful completion of all assessment tasks, participants will receive a statement of attainment for “**CPCCLDG3001A Licence to perform dogging**”.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND THIS COURSE?

Any person directing mobile and tower cranes must have this licence.

Any person operating this equipment must be 18 years or over.
