

Elevating Work Platform Training

Licence to operate a boom-type elevating work platform
(Boom length 11 metres or more) TLILIC508A



This course is a legal requirement for any person who operates an Elevating Work Platform (EWP) 11m and over.

The aim of this course is to train participants in the use of an EWP in accordance with the OHS Act 2000/Regulation 2001 and WorkCover licensing requirements. It provides participants with a licence issued by WorkCover.

To satisfy course requirements, participants are expected to complete written and practical assessment activities. The WorkCover Assessment Instrument will be posted to you upon registration for this course.

Before and during the training, it is vital that you commit extra time to study the course materials. This will ensure you have the best chance possible of completing the assessment exam to Workcover standards and being accredited to use EWPs.

Participants who not pass the final assessment can return to be re-assessed. Re-assessment fees apply.

DURATION: 3 days (2 days training, 1 day assessment)

WHAT TO BRING:

- A WorkCover Assessment Instrument and Learner's Guide will be posted to you upon registration for this course. You must familiarise yourself with these documents prior to doing the course. You will also need to bring them along on the day of training.
- For assessment each participant **MUST** have personal identification that adds up to 100 points. Please see over the page for identification requirements.

Participants without ID will be sent home and will not be able to be assessed.

- Hard hat* (available for purchase from the Local Government Training Institute)
- High visibility vest or clothing* (available for purchase from the Local Government Training Institute)
- steel capped boots

COURSE OUTLINE

The national standard for this high risk unit of competency states participants must be able to:

- Comply with OH&S licensing legislation.
- Use emergency procedures and safety equipment, including the use of safety harnesses, energy absorbers, lanyard and anchor points.
- Assess ground conditions to confirm that the site is suitable (e.g. firm, level and safe) to extend and travel the elevating work platform.
- Conduct risk assessment and hazard control strategies, including hierarchy of control as applied to the positioning and safe operation of the elevating work platform (particular awareness of the risks associated with overhead powerlines/electrical cables, ground conditions, wind, pedestrians and tipping).
- Follow appropriate procedures for estimation of loads, to ensure that the elevating work platform is not overloaded.
- Position and operate the elevating work platform to ensure that the safest lift is performed.



At the completion of this workshop, participants will undertake assessments and need to meet the requirements of the unit “**Licence to operate a boom-type elevating work platform (Boom length 11 metres or more) TLILIC508A**” from the nationally accredited Transport and Logistics Training Package (TLI07).



WHO SHOULD ATTEND THIS COURSE?

Any person operating an EWP of 11m and over must have this licence.
Any person operating this equipment must be 18 years or over.

ATTACHMENT 1: EVIDENCE OF IDENTITY FACT SHEET

An applicant is to provide evidence of identity documents that add up to a minimum of 100 points. These documents should be the same documents that will be provided to a NSW Australia Post Bank@Post outlet as evidence of identity when the application is lodged.

Within the documents, the applicant must be able to show their photo, date of birth, signature and current address. The documents must be **original documents**. Certified copies will not be accepted.

The assessor must verify the applicant's identity, date of birth, signature, and current address prior to commencing the assessment. Assessors must refuse to conduct an assessment where the applicant has failed to provide adequate evidence of identity. The assessor must record the evidence of identity document details in their entirety on the CA1 Form and then hand the documents straight back to the applicant.
