



# Traffic Controller (Blue Card) Course Overview

This course provides training for staff who are required to control traffic with a Stop Slow bat. This course will provide participants with the knowledge, skills and attitudes to perform traffic control safely for their co-workers and the public.

## TARGET AUDIENCE

Any person who may be required to control traffic using a Stop/Slow bat in the Road Construction and Maintenance Industry.

- Understand the role of a Traffic Controller
- Apply the procedures of traffic controlling within a worksite
- Operate a 2-way radio correctly and effectively
- Promote the role of traffic controller in the Community

## PRE-REQUISITES

- Adequate literacy

### **AND HOLD**

- A NSW WorkCover Construction Induction Certificate or equivalent

### **AND HOLD OR HAVE PREVIOUSLY HELD**

- A NSW P2 Drivers Licence or equivalent or higher

### **OR HAVE HELD**

- A NSW Traffic Controller Photo ID Card (expired within the last two years)
- Holders of overseas drivers licences, if not written in English must provide an official translation from the Community Relations Commission for a multicultural NSW or Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC) The issue date must be a minimum of 12 months prior to the date of training.

## PRE-REQUISITES Continued

- Occupational health and safety induction qualifications obtained in Victoria, Queensland and South Australia are deemed to be equivalent to the WorkCover Construction Induction Certificate.
- Participants who do not hold the WorkCover CIC at the commencement of training will be processed for a Traffic Controller – Non Construction Grey Photo card.

## VALIDITY

The Traffic Controllers Photo Identification Card is valid for three (3) years

## DELIVERY

Classroom including practical exercise

Participants must complete knowledge and skills assessment at the end of the course
